

SPECIAL ENROLLMENT PERIOD (SEP)

CERTAIN SITUATIONS WHERE YOU MAY BE ABLE TO JOIN, SWITCH OR DROP A MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN OR A PART D MEDICARE DRUG PLAN

BELOW IS A LIST OF THOSE SITUATIONS WHERE YOU MAY QUALIFY INCLUDING

1. You move to a new address that is not in the plan's service area
2. You move to a new address and you have new plan options
3. You move back to the United States after living outside country
4. You have Medicaid
5. You no longer qualify for Medicaid
6. You qualify for Extra Help paying for Medicare prescription drug coverage
7. You are enrolled into or lose your State Pharmaceutical Assistance Program (SPAP)
8. You move into, currently live, or just moved out of an institution
9. You are released from jail
10. If you lose other creditable prescription drug coverage or coverage changes and is no longer creditable
11. You left coverage from your employer or union (includes COBRA coverage)
12. You leave a Medicare Cost Plan
13. You drop or enroll into coverage in a Program of All -inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) plan
14. You have a change to enroll in other coverage offered by employer or union
15. You are enrolling in TRICARE or VA coverage
16. Medicare takes an official action (sanction) with your plan
17. Medicare terminates my plan's contract
18. You are enrolled into a Special Needs Plan (SNP) and no longer have the condition that qualified you for the plan
19. You joined or choose not to join a plan due to an error by a federal employee
20. You were not properly told that your other drug coverage was creditable coverage
21. Your plan's contract is not renewed
22. You dropped a Medigap (i.e Medicare Supplement) policy the first time you joined a Medicare Advantage Plan
